To talk about officially timetabled future events:
                       My plane leaves at 9 pm.

Simple Present Continuous Concepts

✓ Concept 1:

To talk about actions in progress at the time of speaking: The boys are playing tennis in the garden.

✓ Concept 2:

To talk about temporary habits:

My brother is living in Toronto these days. I am working on a new project this month.

✓ Concept 3:

To talk about arranged future events:

I am seeing my doctor tomorrow. (I have an appointment)

√ Concept 4:

To talk about irritating habits:

she's always coming to class late. He is never listening to me.

Present Perfect Concepts

✓ Concept 1:

To talk about our past experience without referring to the exact time:

I have seen this movie twice before. Have you (ever) been abroad?

√ Concept 2:

To talk about past actions whose effects are still present without referring to the exact time:

I have (already/just) eaten lunch (I am not hungry now)

✓ Concept 3:

To talk about actions which started in the past and are still in progress:

I have worked here since 2000 / for 12 years (I still work)
I have lived here since we moved to Canada.

Present Perfect Continuous Concepts

✓ Concept 1:

To talk about actions which started in the past and are still in progress:

I have been working here for 18 years / since 2000

√ Concept 2:

To emphasize an activity which started in the past and may or may not be in progress now especially to show our feelings:

I have been waiting for you here for two hours.

Simple Past Concepts

√ Concept 1:

To talk about an action that happened once or twice in the past:

I had breakfast yesterday.
I went to the Cinema last night.
I went swimming two days ago.

√ Concept 2:

To talk about an action or a habit that happened repeatedly:

When I was a kid, I ate a lot of chocolate.
I worked here from 1990 to 2000 / for ten years.

Note:

We also use "used to" to talk about actions or a habit that happened repeatedly in the past but not anymore:

When I was a kid, I used to have a lot of chocolate every day.

Simple Past Continuous Concepts

√ Concept 1:

To talk about an action that was in progress when another event took place:

She was watching TV when he arrived.

√ Concept 2:

To talk about two or more actions which were all in progress at the same time:

While I was watching TV, he was fixing his car.



To talk about two past actions one of which happened before the other:



Before / By the time / When I got home, he had left



✓ Concept 1:

To say how long an action went on until another past event took place:



I had been watching TV for an hour when she arrived

Simple Future Concepts

√ Concept 1:

To talk about a decision or a promise:

I will leave at 9 in the morning.

Probably / certainly I will meet him tomorrow.

✓ Concept 2:

An event which is certainly (based on past experience or information) going to happen:

Stay here overnight, the children will love it. Look at those clouds, it will (surely /certainly) rain.

✓ Concept 3:

To talk about sudden decisions which are carried out immediately: *The phone is ringing, I'll get it.*

"To be going to"

Note:

To talk about a decision, we can also use "to be going to"

We're going to leave at 9 in the morning **Probably / certainly** I am going to meet him tomorrow.

To talk about predictions we only use "to be going to": Look at the sky, it is going to rain.

Future Continuous Concepts

✓ Concept 1:

To talk about an action in the future which is already arranged or planned:

We will be serving steak tonight.

Dr. Bruce will be giving a talk on climate change next week.

✓ Concept 2:

To talk about an action in progress at a particular time in future:

I will be taking a bath at 9.

I will be taking a bath when you get back.

(the action is in progress at 9)

√ Concept 1:

To talk about an action which is completed by a particular time in the future:

I will have typed the letters by 9.

By the time you get back, I will have cleaned the house. I will have fixed the car before you arrive home.



√ Concept 1:

To talk about duration of an action which started in the past and is predicted to continue until a particular time in the future:



I will have been working here for 30 years by 2020
